Haymaker Farmers' Market provides a connection between producers of local food and the community by creating a vibrant and sustainable gathering place promoting direct access to fresh and prepared food, agricultural and environmental education and the arts.

Executive Summary

Haymaker Farmers' Market continued for our 31st year in 2023, offering year-round "producer only" markets in Kent, Ohio with the participation of 63 local food vendors and 106 artists and musicians.

Haymaker had over 39,000 customer visits to our markets and more than \$1.4 million in economic impact — showing great community support and impact for our local food economy!

Haymaker brings together a vibrant and inclusive community every Saturday morning, with \$76,000 in food assistance distributed through our programs. Our educational programs partnered with 18 non-profit and community organizations, as well as our events outside the Markets.

A successful transition in Board leadership has helped continue our fiscal solvency, balancing multiple revenue sources (grants, fees for services, and donations). We're grateful to our 12 local business sponsors and the grant funders who contributed to making our work possible. Haymaker focuses on building relationships between local food producers and the community and we continued to grow in 2023 as we fulfill our mission.



Letter from the President

2023 was another incredible year for Haymaker Farmers' Market. We could not have accomplished any of it without our devoted community; customers, vendors, and staff showing up each week. The Market continued to thrive while also making intentional changes toward growth. There is so much that happens behind the scenes to make the Market function. The Board of Directors was expanded and in doing so, allowed for natural shifts in leadership.

My incredible predecessor Lizette Barton, of Barton Farms and Gardens decided to step away from her role as President after 12 years to focus on the growth of their family farm. We are so grateful for her guidance and direction and cannot wait to see what Barton Farms and Gardens does in 2024!

Board members continued focus on ongoing goals and projects, like expanding access to education and local food, brought us the July farm tour. Guests explored Brimfield Bread Oven, Brockett Family Farm, and Wren Box Farm, all of whom graciously shared their expertise with us. Experiences like this one, inperson classes at the indoor market, and fundraising all work together to showcase the incredible work of our neighbors and vendors who work so hard to bring us amazing food, art, and cultivate a space unlike anything else.

This year, ongoing monthly support grew 26%, all thanks to community donors. This support allowed us to offer more Market programming, foster staff expertise, and make incremental contributions towards our eventual goal of a permanent indoor space. As a monthly donor myself, I want to thank everyone for making this year so successful. In 2024, we hope to grow this support and encourage everyone to consider a small monthly amount to keep the momentum going.

We value the trust that our community has in Haymaker and cannot wait to bring you the best local food in 2024.




Monthly Vendor Sales for 2023

Haymaker Farmers' Market promotes access to fresh, healthy, local food. Local food assistance programs at Market make food more affordable while also supporting our vendors.

Haymaker centrally administers all these programs and coordinates additional bulk purchases from our vendors for distribution by social services. In 2023 we accepted \$73,479 of food assistance benefits.

Growing Our Community

Haymaker moved to a **new** winter location: the Hobbs Hall building of the Unitarian Universalist Church of Kent. Our new location offers a commercial kitchen that we used to provide educational programs:

- Water-bath and pressure canning classes with Central State University
- Chef Demo by Ms Julie, where she showcased vendor products and provided take-home recipes





We again partnered with Kent State University on the Kent State Farmers Market (KSFM). The KSFM brings local food to students, faculty, & staff and connects them to our community. Markets were held monthly during Fall and Spring semesters. The KSFM has also increased student participation in our Saturday Markets.



Music at the Market

Haymaker also supports local arts. With support of the City of Kent, the Ohio Arts Council, and The Portage Foundation, Haymaker hosts public music performances from 10 am - 12 pm every Saturday. In 2023 we had 41 music groups perform over 100 hours of free music at the market.

2023 FINANCE REPORT

Letter from the Treasurer

Haymaker Farmers' Market had a great fiscal year. Our income exceeded our expenses, thanks to the income generated by grants, sponsorships, and donations. We tripled our grant dollars from 2022. This allowed us to expand our existing food access programs and start a new one: Produce Prescription (PRx). We also added a new revenue stream in the form of an interest earning savings account.

In 2023, I took over for our previous treasurer: Ami Gignac. We appreciate her 9 years of service and the expertise she shared with the Market years of service and the expertise she shared with the Market.

This year, I worked with our Market Director to make our bookkeeping process more efficient and transparent. We look forward to continuing these efforts in 2024.

Looking ahead to 2024, our primary fundraising event will be the Farm-to-Table dinner. Our goal is to build on the success of the Farm-to-Table brunch last held in 2022. We plan to continue the Produce Prescription (PRx) food access program. And are working with other local healthcare providers to expand the program. We are also seeking funds to restore the Market Stanzas Mural under Haymaker Parkway.



Expand food access programs

Plans to expand our "Produce Prescription" (PRx) program with University Hospitals – Portage Medical Center and create a second PRx program with the Kent Health Department and AxcessPointe.

We will partner with Produce Perks Midwest and others again to offer "Food Access Days" in July and August that help make local food access more equitable.

Provide educational opportunities through community garden

Haymaker will coordinate the "Edible Kent" garden beds - a free, public food garden demonstration on Franklin Ave, next to our Outdoor Season location.
